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
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Investigation Continues in Tragic Death of Sandra Bland **Bv CARRIE PRAZAK-GOURLEY** The Waller Times

On Friday, July 10, at 4:30 p.m., 28-year-old Sandra Bland was pulled over by a Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) officer in Prairie View. just outside the entrance to Prairie View A&M University, for allegedly failing to signal when changing lanes and running a stop sign. During the stop, the DPS Trooper requested backup and was joined by a local City of Prairie View female officer who assisted in the arrest of Bland for alleged "assault of a public servant" and later transported her to the Waller County Jail in Hempstead.

Bland, a 2009 graduate of Prairie View A&M, drove to Texas on July 9 from her home in Naperville, Illinois to interview for a job at her alma mater. According to Yolanda Bevill, a university spokeswoman. Bland had been awarded a job in the school's cooperative extension program and was scheduled to begin on August 3.

According to Waller County Sheriff Glenn Smith, Bland used the phone several times over the weekend to call family and friends, but as of Monday morning, no one had posted a bond on her behalf. Bond in the case had been set at \$5,000, which is the typical bond amount for a charge of this type.

Sheriff Smith stated that Bland had been held alone in a cell over the weekend and had been served breakfast at about 7 a.m. Monday morning, July 13. At 8 a.m. a supervisor spoke

to her over the intercom in regards to to see if she would like to go outside for her request to use the phone. Then, at 8:55 a.m., a jailer went to Bland's cell

Waller City Council Votes to Accept Chiefs Settlement Package

On Monday, July 20, the Waller City Council met at 7 p.m. at the Waller ISD Boardroom. Council members Nancy Arnold, Edna Eaton, Dwayne Hajek, Sidney Johnson, and Mike McCormick were present and Mayor Danny Marburger presided.

During public comments, former council member Rick Dalton addressed council on his concern that the city is spend-

ing too much money on offering packages to employees.

Dalton stated, "Is this the way our tax money should be spent? I think we should look at retaining good people rather than getting them out the door. And I am concerned about who is next. Is there a list of packages to be offered? Currently, Officer Christopher Smith is on administrative leave. Is he the next to receive a package? You are elected to council to do

not for yourselves."

Council then went into executive session at 7:31 p.m. pursuant to section 551.071 of the Texas Government Code to seek the advice of an attorney regarding the employment and possible retirement of the Chief of Police, Phil Rehak.

After reconvening at 7:49 p.m., the matter of the Chief's package was brought up for discussion.

During the discussion, both Council member Arnold

and Hajek stated that in good not do anything wrong. It is the conscience that they must vote against the package offered to the chief.


"Not at all because I am against the Chief, but rather I am against the process used in offering this package," Arnold said.

Hajek added, "I'm against the whole process that went down. It went down incorrectly and I cannot support it."

Council member Sidney Johnson then stated, "We did same process we followed in other cases (the settlements offered to Chavez and Edwards)."

Council member Hajek then asked to speak, saying that what Johnson was saying was not correct and that he wanted to clarify Johnson's statements. However, Mayor Marburger cut off the conversation and did not allow Johnson to continue or allow Hajek to make his statement.

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In Aftermath of Sandra Bland's Death

On Friday, July 10, 2015, Sandra Bland, 28-year-old Illinois native and a 2009 graduate of Prairie View A&M University, was pulled over by a Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) Trooper in Prairie View for allegedly failing to signal when changing lanes and running a stop sign. A run-in with the Trooper ensued and a call for backup was made. Bland was later transported to the Waller County Jail in Hempstead by a Prairie View female police officer, who answered the call for backup.

Three days later, on Monday, July 13, 2015, at 8:55 a.m., Bland was found dead in her jail cell by a Waller County jailer, a little over two hours after she was last seen in person.

Waller County Sheriff R. Glenn Smith stated that Bland had been held alone in her cell over the weekend, since her \$5,000 bail had not been paid, and had been served breakfast at about 7 a.m. that Monday morning. At 8 a.m. a supervisor spoke to her over the intercom, according to reports. Then, at 8:55 a.m., a jailer went to Bland's cell to see if she would like to go outside for recreation, and found her hanging from a privacy partition from a "rope" made out of a trash bag. According to the Sheriff, EMS was called and CPR was administered immediately, but it was too late.

On July 16, Bland's death was officially ruled a suicide by asphyxiation by the Harris County Medical Examiner's Office

Since that time, Bland's death has

made national headlines as speculation mounted on how and why she died. Family, friends, and supporters of Bland assert that she would not have taken her own life and have made sure the national media was kept on alert.

Locally, officials have seemingly released everything they can to alleviate fears of a conspiracy that seems to grow by the day in the small Hempstead-Prairie View community, much of it rallied by outside influences.

According to District Attorney Elton Mathis, jail video footage from outside the cell did not show anyone entering Bland's cell Monday morning. "Bland was completely alone all morning, according to the video," stated Mathis.

Maybe alone too long, according to the Texas Commission of Jail Standards, who oversees Texas jails.

the events of the morning inside the jail did not bode well for Smith. According to his own press release issued on Friday, July 17 at 5:58 p.m., Smith acknowledged that his office had received a copy of a Special Inspection Report from the Texas Commission on Jail Standards that determined that two deficiencies in the jail existed.

First, jail staff are required to undergo two hours yearly of mental health training in accordance with their approved Mental Disabilities/Suicide Prevention Plan. (This reportedly is an effort to make sure jailers are qualified to identify and prevent suicides on their watch.) In the case of Bland, the WCSO was unable to provide documentation that jailers caring for Bland had the training. Smith said that two jailers had received mental health training but not in the past year.

While the footage may comfort some,

CALH: New Findings at Pintail Landfill Site Alarming

On Friday, July 17, Citizens Against the Landfill in Hempstead (CALH) representatives and experts were admitted to the proposed Pintail Landfill site for further scientific investigations. The main purpose of the trip was to check the water table elevations on-site. According to CALH representative Rick Welch, who accompanied the experts on Friday, part of the MSW landfill application process requires applicants to measure the water table elevations over time.

Welch stated Pintail did this from July 2011 to July 2012, during the drought, and has proclaimed that they have measured the highest possible water table elevations during that period.

"They have also proclaimed in their application that there are no groundwater springs within a mile of the site, "Welch said. "Friday's inspections revealed otherwise."

According to CALH, there are a total of 15 shallow, small diameter water wells on site, called piezom-

eters, for the sole purpose of measuring the water table elevations. CALH experts measured water table elevations in all 15 wells and determined the average increase in elevation, or decrease in depth below the ground surface, was over 5', with the greatest increase being almost 7'. CALH claims Pintail attempted to design the depths of excavations for their landfill cells in some areas to within a foot of the highest measurements that they took. It now appears that large ar-

eas of the landfill liner will be submerged below the water table.

Also alarming was that one of the piezometers on the southern part of the landfill footprint was actually spewing groundwater as the team approached. CALH's experts all indicated that in over 35 years each of doing this type of work, they had never seen a piezometer in artesian conditions where groundwater was actively flowing from one. A review of the drilling logs indicated that it was likely that groundwater was seeping to the surface over a large area and feeding the wetlands in the southern portion of the site.

CALH said that the overall increase in the height of the water table and active springs on-site are recent findings that will be added to other compelling expert testimony and evidence to be presented at the Contested Case Hearing scheduled to begin on November 2, 2015. On August 12-13, the Perseids Meteor Shower will occur. Perseids produces about 60 meteors per hour at its peak. The shower runs from July 17- August 24, but peaks on the night of August 12 through the morning of the 13, best visible from a dark moon location after midnight.

So what might these heavenly signs mean to us?





"My deepest sympathies are with the family of Ms. Sandra Bland. As the State Senator for Waller County, I am very concerned and call for a full and thorough investigation by state and federal authorities," Kolkhorst stated.

Second, Smith was notified that Waller County is not completing face-to-face observations of all inmates at least once every 60 minutes as required by law. In the Bland case, the 8 a.m. contact with her was made via intercom and not in person. Smith stated

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he did not feel like this deficiency contributed to Bland's death but promised to work on any improvements he can to make sure tragic events like this never happen again.

In his statements on the findings, Smith promised that he see that this type of tragic inci-

would not tolerate the disregarding of policies or rules of the Texas Commission on Jail Standards or of their own policies by any of his employees.

"We will be working on improvements that can be made to dent never happens again," Smith said. "This will include personnel changes if needed."
