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CALH cautions citizens about new plans for Pintail

On Monday, September 21, 2015, Pintail Landfill, LLC submitted a Status Report to the SOAH Court, as ordered by the Administrative Law Judges (ALJs) in Order No. 17. The Status Report was to advise the ALJs on the status of what amendments would have to be made to Pintail's landfill application in order to deal with the new increased water table elevation data that was collected by CALH on July 17 during a site visit.

According to CALH, Pintail admitted in their original July 22, 2015 Motion for Continuance and Stay that their landfill application does not satisfy TCEQ permitting rules and that wholesale changes are necessary to meet TCEQ requirements. Pintail reportedly stated, "The changes that will need to be made to Pintail's permit application potentially af-

fect nearly every aspect of the application and the testimony and exhibits of nearly all of Pintail's witnesses."

They also proclaimed that they expected that process to take approximately 45 days to complete, CALH said. Sixty-one days later, on September 21, their Status Report consists of only three pages. CALH states that it confirms the worst fears and concerns of opponents to the landfill who are worried about contamination of the Gulf Coast Aquifer and a source of drinking water for the Hempstead area.

According to CALH, the Status Report confirms that Pintail now plans on submerging portions of the liner into the water table using dewatering techniques just long enough to lower the water table to the point of being able to construct the

liner and deposit enough waste to act as ballast against the uplift of the water table once dewatering operations cease and the water rises up to submerge the liner.

If that were not bad enough, CALH claims, the Status Report also contains additional water table elevation measurements taken since CALH's July 17 site visit that show that the water table elevations have only minimally declined since then, and that the overall groundwater elevation gradient across the site is much greater than originally reported in their application. Since the groundwater flow velocity off of the site is dependent on this gradient, the flow velocity will be much greater than originally reported, spreading any contamination at a much faster rate, CALH said.

CALH representative Bill Huntsinger

commented that, given Pintail's intentional destruction of field notes and soil samples from their original subsurface investigation and other intentional spoliation of evidence, Pintail should not be trusted to make any amendments to the application. "This application should be denied outright and no new plans should be allowed," Huntsinger stated.

Pintail was expected to file its Response to CALH's and the City of Hempstead's Motion for Sanctions due to the Spoliation of Evidence on September 25, 2015. After that briefing is submitted, protestants are hopeful that the ALJs will render a quick and positive decision, recommending dismissal of Pintail's application. Those involved anticipate that the decision will be forthcoming by late October, 2015.

National Life Chain changing hearts and minds through witness and prayer

Most Americans do not realize it, but Roe v. Wade wiped out the laws of 46 states that outlawed abortion, and was the most gut-wrenching decision in the history of the court, never coming close to gaining full acceptance as the "law of the land".

At Life Chain, attendees stand with more than a million pro-life individuals throughout the USA and Canada in honor of the 58 million babies whose lives have been lost to abortion. Prayer works, too. As an example of the power of prayer, in 2012, a woman stopped at the Cleburne, Texas Life Chain to tell the group that in 1998, intent on having an abortion, she drove by the signs. The encounter made her reverse her decision and today she has a beautiful 14 year-old daughter. Stories like this one are abundant, and are prime examples of the power of prayer.

This year our silent majority received a wake-up call when the Center for Medical Progress released a series of undercover videos revealing the system-wide conspiracy of Planned Parenthood (the nation's largest abortion provider) to evade the law and make money off of aborted fetal tissue. The video repulsed an entire nation, from

liberal to conservative, pundits were horrified with what the videos contain.

One "pro-choice" USA Today columnist, Ruben Navarrette Jr., stated, "I am pro-choice, but even I express horror and outrage at what is seen in the videos."

The columnist went on to say, "I have to say, that over the years as I looked at the moral equation, I sided with the mother, and tried never to think about the baby."

Isn't that the problem? People don't think about the baby. But, if Christians will not stand for the baby, who will? If not now, after these ghastly videos, when?

In Waller County there will be two Life Chain locations on Respect Life Sunday, October 4 from 2 p.m. - 3 p.m. One location is in Waller along FM 2920, and attendees will meet in the Arlan's parking lot near the Ranchito Restaurant. A second location is in Hempstead, at the junction of Business 290 and Hwy. 6, and participants are to meet in front of the old McDonald's.

Life Chain takes place during the bi-annual 40 Days For Life, which is now an international group that campaigns through prayer and fasting to

end abortion. The upcoming 40 days will begin on September 23 and last through November 1. 40 Days began in 2014 in Bryan-College Station. The name refers to several events in the Bible lasting 40 days, such as Moses' 40 days on Mount Sinai and Jesus' 40 days in the desert. Today 40 Days for Life takes place in hundreds of locations, including Waller, and in 30 countries on five continents.

The mission of the Life Chain and Forty Days for Life is to bring together all Christians as the Body of Christ in a spirit of unity during the 40-day campaign, to seek God's favor to turn hearts and minds from a culture of death to a culture of life.

Prayer is powerful, and Christ Himself said that there is evil that can only be driven out with prayer and fasting.

And prayer has worked. As a result of the pro-life movement, abortion has declined by 14% between 2011 and 2014. According to data from the Guttmacher Institute, a world-renowned organization seeking to advance reproductive health, in 1994, 54% of unintended pregnancies ended in abortion. By 2008, that number had fallen to 39%.

In addition, many current

surveys reveal that the current generation of young adults is far more skeptical about abortion than the previous one. In fact, young adults have started a movement titled "My Gen-

eration Will End Abortion." A moving video of the same title was produced by the Texas Alliance for Life, and is available to

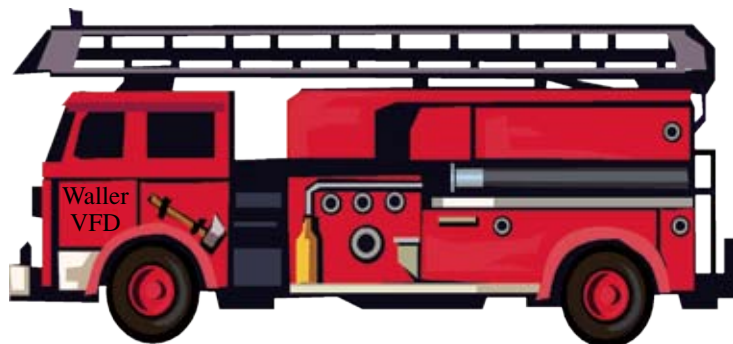

Rockport: Charm of the Texas Coast

Rockport is known by its well-deserved nickname, "Charm of the Texas Coast", and as a frequent visitor, I can testify to the truthfulness of that slogan. Voted the #5 Best Small Coastal Town by USA today, it has long been a favorite coastal destination of Texans.

Due to decades long efforts of the Keep Rockport Beautiful organization, the city was well-planned with numerous parks, nature trails, and abundant landscaping throughout. Through grants, Rockport has also developed a walkable downtown, with wide sidewalks, esplanades, streetlamps and an assortment of colorful shops.

The city is located on the mid-Texas coast on Live Oak Peninsula, and is surrounded on three sides by water--Copano Bay to the east and north and Aransas Bay to the south. The barrier islands, San Jose and Mustang, protect the area from the direct onslaught of a hurricane. Due to the close proximity of the towns of Rockport and Fulton, the area is commonly referred to as Rockport-Fulton.

Rockport is home to one of only two Texas beaches to earn the highly esteemed Blue Wave Beach recognition. This title is

handed out yearly by Washington, D.C.-based Clean Beaches Coalition, which certifies that shorelines are clean, healthy, and well-managed. Each site must meet stringent standards to be a part of the program.

The beach offers 75 covered picnic tables, three beachfront playgrounds, a ¼ mile walking trail, a bird nesting sanctuary, as well as an 800 ft. fishing pier.

What makes Rockport unique is the wide-variety of amenities, activities, and attractions available to visitors. First and foremost, the town is known to be a fisherman's paradise, dotted throughout with fishing piers, boat launches and marinas. Anglers are destined to find plenty of fish in the sea. The bays are perfect for fisherman to spend a day on their boats catching trout or redfish. For kayakers like ourselves, several

launches are available, but our favorite is on Copano Bay on the north side of the peninsula at Howard Murph Park, where visitors can also witness gorgeous nightly sunsets.

For those interested in art, Rockport is nationally renowned as an artist's colony, and the town sports a dozen galleries and studios for the art collector.

Shoppers can spend the day downtown, which offers a variety of shops--from boutique clothing stores, antiques and collectables, souvenirs, and books--there is something of interest for every visitor.

Not to be missed downtown is the iconic Busted Pot Junk Museum, a tourist destination for over 40 years. The Busted Post is a combination antique store, flea market and museum. Everything can be found there from fishing poles to the kitchen

sink. Other favorite attractions include the Fulton Mansion, built in the 1870's by cattleman George W. Fulton. Innovative for its time, the house features indoor plumbing, as well as central lighting and heating. Another attraction, the Texas Maritime Museum, explores Texas' rich maritime heritage, from Spanish exploration to the modern day search for offshore oil and gas.

Lodging is abundant--from beautiful bed and breakfasts, to condos and lodges, hotels and motels--there's plenty of overnight accommodations. For example, Hoopes House Bed and Breakfast is an 1890's era Victorian mansion listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is a favorite of visitors. Hoopes House offers

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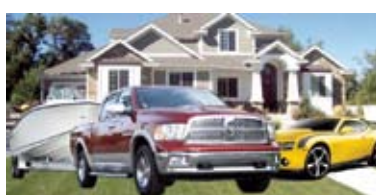

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times, has twice been named the Coors Man in the Can, and he's been named the PRCA Act of the Year six times.

All those awards are nice, but what makes Lerwill one of the most sought-after entertainers in rodeo is what he does in the arena – in addition to his fantastic daredevil act, the Payson, Utah, man has the timing of a comedic genius.

It comes quite naturally to Lerwill, the son of a roper who grew up going to rodeos in Utah and Colorado with his father. Though he never competed, Troy Lerwill was hooked ... even if it took a few years for him to realize it.

"I had a Shetland pony growing up, and I always like horses," Lerwill said. "I roped with my dad when I was little, but I always wanted a motorcycle."

His parents realized he was pretty good at maneuvering the machine and began taking him to desert races. By the time he was 12, Lerwill was excelling at motocross.

"It just evolved from there," he said.

Racing was a big part of Lerwill's life for a long time. But at age 24, Lerwill had begun riding mountain bikes through the Utah trails instead of the motorized ones over the quick jumps and turns of motocross. Through all that, he found a new rush: Bullfighting. The rodeo arena was drawing him back. He went to a bullfighting school, and a new career was born.

"I got my PRCA card in 1993," he said. "I started doing the comedy stuff in '95."

It didn't take long for Lerwill to step up his game. He has become one of the most sought-after acts in ProRodeo, and there's good reason.

"People just love to watch Troy, because he's that good," Carr said. "He can bring people to your rodeo to see what he can do; that's a true entertainer."

For Lerwill, life is about reaching out to people and sharing his passion for the rodeo way of life. He may go about it in different terms than most cowboys, but there is a distinct passion involved in everything he does.

"I really don't want the Western heritage and lifestyle, and the tradition of cowboy to go away, and I want young people to enjoy it like I did," Lerwill said. "Rodeo is a huge chunk of our history."

"Even though I take a motorcycle to a rodeo and do a stunt, I hope it makes fans of people and they come back."

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Plant now to attract Hummingbirds next Spring

Ruby-throated hummingbirds are again making their annual migration to their wintering grounds in Mexico and Central America. Most of us have observed the lively birds as they zip and zoom around fighting for the best spot on flowers and feeders.

During their major migration from mid-August to mid-October, hummingbirds need nectar as well as trees for nesting and roosting at night. Feeders can attract the hummers, but given a choice, hummingbirds will always pick flowers any day over a feeder. If you want to attract more of the tiny birds, add to your landscaping by planting their favorite nectar producers.

Number one on the list is native Turks Cap, a hibiscus that is a primary food source for the migrating hummingbirds. This is not the commonly known Mexican hibiscus variety, but rather produces up-turned

smaller scarlet blooms that look like miniature turbans.

Salvias are also winners to a hummingbird's eyes, particularly scarlet sage, which is a perennial Salvia that grows to three feet tall in shade or sun, with scarlet red flower spikes. If you cannot find Scarlet Sage, plant any Salvia, because hummingbirds love the tall, colorful spikes.

Cenizo or Texas Sage, which blooms profusely with small lavender flowers after a rain, is also popular with hummingbirds, and is a low maintenance choice.

Another hummingbird attracting plant is the coral honeysuckle, which is an evergreen vine native to Southeast Texas that bears trumpet flower clusters spring through fall, followed by fruit relished by other birds.

Esperanza, a popular South Texas perennial sun-loving shrub is another plant which attracts hummingbirds. It grows up to 10 feet tall with clusters of

yellow trumpet-shaped flowers spring through fall. The 'Gold Star' selection is preferred due to its profuse blooms.

Another favorite of gardeners to plant to attract hummingbirds is the Bottlebrush, which grows to be 10 feet tall and requires a lot of space. Hummingbirds have a special affinity for the sweet nectar of the Bottlebrush.

So start planting any of these hummingbird favorites to guarantee lots of visits to your garden when these little dynamos pass our area through again next March.

As a word of caution, for those who choose to use a feeder, be sure to use one that

can be easily cleaned and avoid feeders with bee guards, which may injure the hummers. Also, do not use red food coloring. As long as there is some red on the feeder, hummingbirds will find it. Also, it is not necessary to buy commercial hummer nectar, as it's very easy to make. Simply mix hot water and sugar -- 4 parts water to one part sugar. Never use honey or artificial sugar.

Remember that planting a hummingbird garden is by far the ideal way to attract hummingbirds, far more effective than feeders. By just planting a few of these garden suggestions, hummingbirds may return to your yard year after year.

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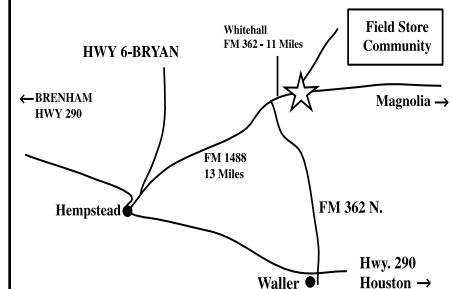
